# Brooks-Howell's Sliding Payment Scale for Long-Term Care

Brooks-Howell is proud to offer an affordable sliding scale option for long-term care which meets the financial needs of individuals making only \$40,000 a year and above. According to Lauren Leatherby in the *Journalist Resource*, a senior's majority of annual out-of-pocket expenses are for nursing home care. Brooks-Howell's sliding scale provides up to a 60% savings of the average cost of long-term care in North Carolina. The only out of pocket expenses for the resident is pharmacy, physician, and therapy co-pays.

Many of our residents have spent their life in service as missionaries, deaconesses, clergy, home missioners, staff of United Methodist organizations, active members of United Methodist churches and many more. This outreach to the community is in keeping with Brooks-Howell's motto of "called, served and serving still" and seeks to remove the financial barrier to stellar long-term health care for seniors. Brooks-Howell joins Dementia Friendly WNC (DFWNC) to ensure Brooks-Howell continues to be a welcoming and knowledgeable organization for residents and others with dementia. One way Brooks-Howell is supporting DFWNC is through the provision of office space for this grassroots organization. DFWNC is a group of individuals, caregivers, community members, organizations and persons with dementia who are committed to the well-being of people living with dementia and their families. DFWNC provides educational services to religious organizations and community service organizations. In addition, they educate businesses frequented by persons with dementia such as restaurants, banks, grocery stores, pharmacies and others.



Each staff member of Brooks-Howell participated in DFWNC's informative inter-active education workshop, including non-clinical staff such as dietary, environmental services, and administrative staff. Each staff member has the opportunity to expand their awareness of interacting with persons with dementia both inside and outside Brooks-Howell. ## Community Medical Clinic Now Open

On December 6, 2018 Brooks-Howell opened an on-site Community Medical Clinic for seniors in need. The Community Medical Clinic is open to all United Methodist Church members and others over the age of 65 who are not insured or are under-insured. This service will enable seniors to see a geriatric-trained practitioner who understands the aging adult. The Clinic will also have an on-site pharmacist to assist in



medication education and medication review. In addition, a sliding payment scale is offered to seniors who otherwise may not be able to afford the services. The Medical Clinic is open every Thursday from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM. Contact medical.care@brookshowell.org to find out more.
